Deputy Mayor Murphy commented on the following:

Automated Waste Collection details are in the final stages and an announcement will be coming early May. To help better understand resident concerns we kindly ask residents take 2 minutes to complete an online survey. The survey is available until April 23rd.

Our water and sewer projects will begin next week in the Indian Pond and Heritage Road areas. We expect approximately 6 weeks of construction and thank residents for their patience while municipal services are being installed.

Public Works staff have begun line painting in school zones and it is expected to take several weeks dependent on weather. We ask motorists to please use caution when travelling through road work zones. As well, as the weather improves more children will be walking and riding to school and using school play areas. Reduce speeds and be aware when travelling through school zones.

Mobile App

- The Town's mobile app was developed in 2015;
- Since it was launched, nearly 3,000 people have downloaded it from the App Store or Google Play; Since January 1 of this year, over 200 people have downloaded the tool;
- Usage of the Town's mobile app remains strong, with nearly 6,000 visitors in 2018;
- Encouraged residents to download and use.

Downhome Expo

- The Town partnered with Ocean Quest Adventures in a booth for the 7th Annual Downhome Expo; He noted that originally we were supposed to share but the Town ended up with having its own.
- The Town's booth featured tourism material, as well as information about upcoming initiatives such as automated waste collection and Resident Alert;
- The Expo was well-attended and offered a valuable opportunity to engage with the general public;
- Exact attendance numbers are not yet available, but it is estimated that at least 10,000 people attended throughout the weekend.

Topsail Beach Chalet

- The Town will assist the Conception Bay Area Chamber of Commerce to offer canteen services (known as "Maggie's Place") at Topsail Beach;
- The canteen will operate for 8 weeks this summer and will be run by student/youth entrepreneurs;
- The Town's contribution will be towards the refurbishment of the small building at the beach (valued at approximately \$2,000);
- This service is an excellent opportunity for youth to gain experience in project management, human resources, and other aspects of running a business.
